As you read this, we will probably be immersed in the last couple of weeks before Easter. It’s a busy time for people within the church as well as for those who do not profess the Christian faith. It’s spring.

There is much to do. My mind will be occupied with thoughts about the last couple of weeks of Jesus’ life. I wonder about those, privileged enough, to be around the Lord in those closing days of his tenure upon the earth. The disciples and those who knew him were experiencing the depth of their humanness and the limitations of their faith and devotion. The Lordship of Christ gave way to selfish desires, resentment and pride. All of which are the “daily sins of the heart” as Gregory writes in his book, *Dinner With A Perfect Stranger*. At least one would betray him. At least one would not understand him. At least one would fall asleep and ignore him. At least one would deny him. At least one would question his authority and power. At least one would doubt him. At least one would not

recognize him. And at least one would run and cower. I say “at least” because I believe there were others in that day who were guilty of these traits of the human condition. I also believe there are those who are reading this that have faced the same struggles in their experiments of faith, still, God has not given up upon us and I thank my God for that. Just as he forgave those who were with him in that first century for their limitations and brokenness, so he forgives me for my deficiencies. I want you to have this same assurance in your life as well. Perhaps I am not able to explain it or preach it in a way that you can understand. I accept that about myself. But maybe by participating in the events of Holy Week and the subsequent celebration of Easter, God will work out in you the same assurance that others have come to know as a rebirth and a regeneration of their soul. I pray that you will experience the Christ Event in all of its power and rejoice on that day in which we shout, “Christ is risen!”

The Living Dramatization of Leonardo da Vinci’s “The Last Supper”

Leonardo, versatile genius of the Renaissance, was born near Vinci, Italy in 1452. Though he excelled in many fields, he is remembered today because of two wonderful paintings: *The Mona Lisa* and *The Last Supper*.

In 1494, when Leonardo was 42, he was commissioned by the Duke of Milan to decorate the dining room of the Convent

Church which was the favorite shrine of the Duke’s young bride. As an appropriate theme for this dining room, the painter chose *The Last Supper*. His painting was not intended to be a faithful reproduction of the original scene as it had taken place in first century Palestine, but as it might have taken place in fifteenth century Italy.

He chose what he considered the most dramatic moment of *The Last Supper*. In this living dramatization, the twelve apostles speak their minds to themselves, to each other and to the Lord in light of the words that they have just heard Jesus speak, “One of you will betray me.”

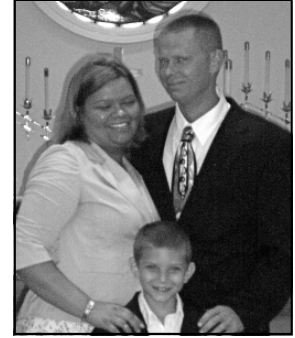
